The results of this comprehensive study indicated that the RTI model reduced the number of students evaluated for special education services, essentially eliminated the disproportional rate at which ethnic minority and male students were referred for special education evaluations, and substantially reduced the amount of financial resources dedicated to unnecessary special

education evaluations. Schools implementing RTI provide parents information about their child's progress, the instructions and interventions used, the staff who are delivering the instruction and the academic or behavioral goals for the child. This brief shows the promise of these practices in advancing educator preparation and practice. As a result of this screening process, struggling learners are provided with interventions at increasing levels of intensity to accelerate their rate of comprehension. These services are often provided by a variety of personnel, including regular classroom teachers, special educators, and specialists. It would go beyond the scope of this article to describe what these studies and meta-analyses found to be critical components of quality instruction and curriculum, but there is a well-confirmed research base that quality instruction leads to fewer students needing additional support. School districts in every state in the country are currently implementing RTI and some have been doing so for over 20 years with impressive results. Instead of random assignment, their study used a multiple baseline design, which examines outcome data from an intervention with a staggered onset of implementation.
